**INDEPENDENT HEARING PANEL**

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**INTRODUCTION**

1. Pursuant sections 34 and 34A of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA), Matamata-Piako District Council has delegated to Bill Wasley (Chair), and James Whetu as hearing commissioners (Hearing Panel) the power to hear submissions and make a decision on a resource consent application made by Matamata-Piako District Council to establish and operate a indoor sports and recreation facility at Matamata College, Station Road, Matamata.
2. The purpose of Direction #1 is to set out the directions for the hearing of the resource consent application and to establish a timetable for the exchange of evidence.

**HEARING**

3. The hearing will be held on Thursday 1 August 2024, commencing at 9.30am. A hearing notice advising parties about the venue and times will be issued in due course.
4. After liaising with all parties/submitters in advance of the hearing, the Hearing Administrator will prepare a hearing schedule which will show the hearing sequence and time allocated to each party/submitter that seeks to be heard by the Hearing Panel. However, it should be noted that there may be some variation to that schedule during the hearing due to any circumstances that may arise.

**EXCHANGE OF EVIDENCE**

5. Section 41B of the RMA sets out the minimum timeframes for the provision of evidence prior to the commencement of a hearing. Consistent with s41B and in the interest of facilitating an efficient hearing, the Hearing Panel sets the following timetable for the exchange of evidence:
  - (a) The Council's s42A Hearing Report shall be made available on the Council's website no later than 4pm on Friday 5 July 2024.
  - (b) The applicant's expert evidence shall be made available on the Council's website no later than 4pm on Tuesday 16 July 2024
  - (c) Any submitter's expert evidence is to be lodged with the Council and made

available on its website no later than 4pm on Tuesday 23 July 2024.

- (d) Any party intending to present legal submissions shall provide a copy of the written legal submissions to the Council and made available on its website no later than 4pm, Friday 26 July 2024.

## HEARING PROTOCOL

6. Unless otherwise advised by the Hearing Panel, all pre-circulated evidence will be taken as read by the Hearing Panel. Accordingly, witnesses will not be required to read their pre-circulated evidence in full at the hearing. Instead, witnesses should present a written summary of their evidence.
7. For the avoidance of doubt, lay submitter representations are not required to be pre-circulated, and may be presented on the day of the appearance.
