Building Act changes

From 1 March, there will be some changes to the Building Act that all trades people working in the building sector need to know.

The changes are designed to provide a skilled and productive building and housing workforce to ensure our country has good quality, affordable homes and buildings.

Stock crossings

Farmers need to use rural roads to move stock from time to time or on a regular basis. If you need to move stock along or across rural roads, you need to apply for a stock permit.

Regardless of how far or how often you need to move stock along the road, you need a stock permit. If you already have a permit, it's important that you adhere to the conditions stated on it to help keep our roads safe.

Are your roadside trees a safety hazard?

While trees are an important part of our environment, if they are too close to our road edges they can become a safety hazard for drivers.

Many roads have trees planted by land owners and occasionally they cause a problem.

For existing trees on rural roads:

- trees need to be maintained by the adjacent landowner
- growth is to be 2 metres clear of the carriage way on straight roads
- growth shall be maintained to give a sight distance of 300m minimum from driveways, intersections and bends

Any new plantings should be discussed with Council.

Waihou Wastewater Treatment Plant

Due to continually improving standards, the Waihou Wastewater Treatment Plant is in need of an upgrade for the first time in over 20 years.

The upgrade will improve the quality of treated water and will reduce the nitrogen concentration to a level that meets current environmental standards.

Brian Perry Civil won the contract for the work and will begin the upgrade in early February and aim to complete it by October 2012.



The current Wastewater Treatment Plant at Waihou
