**DECISION ON THE PAPERS**

This is an application for a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under an existing on-licence in respect of a premises situated at 46 Canada Street, Morrinsville known as Pilot on Canada Street. The premises is a Tavern and has a current on-licence with an expiry date of 1 November 2019. A renewal of this on licence has been applied for and is currently processing.

The reason for the temporary authority is due to the business changing ownership. The takeover date is 13 December 2019. The applicant will be the new owner of the business. The applicant has been advised no alcohol is to be sold until the issuing of this Temporary Authority.

There is one director of G M Hospitality Limited. Gurpreet Singh. Gurpreet is also the sole director of G B Hospitality Limited. That company operates the 131 Restaurant and Bar in Paeroa. That premise holds an on licence. Singh has operated that premises for the past six months, there have been no issues with the operation of the mentioned premises. Gurpreet is a senior lecturer employed by MIT in Auckland.

Gurpreet is not the holder of a Managers Certificate. Three current staff members hold a manager's certificate; they are to remain in the employment of the applicant.

Mr Singh intends to leave the day-to-day running of the premises in the hands of Karlie Mills, she has worked at Pilot for the past eighteen months.

No matters in opposition to this temporary authority have been raised by the Inspector or by the Police.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard and we grant the applicant a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under the existing licence.

Section 136(4) of the Act requires the Committee, on making an order, to impose any conditions that the Act requires an on or on-licence to be issued subject to, may impose any conditions that the Act enables the licence to be issued subject to and may impose any other reasonable conditions it thinks fit. Sections 112, 116 and 117 of the Act detail compulsory and discretionary conditions of the licence in force.


The temporary authority is subject to the following conditions in addition to the existing conditions of the licence in force:

- a) It is a condition of this Temporary Authority that the holder must comply with all the conditions of the current off-licence, and the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- b) That an application for an on-licence be made within two months of the date of issue.
- c) The temporary authority must be displayed next to the base licence attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrance.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.136(5) of the Act which states that the person authorised by this order has the same duties, obligations, and liabilities, as the holder of the underlying on-licence concerned.

The certificate can be issued immediately.
