## **DECISION ON THE PAPERS**

This is an application by Special Spirits Limited for renewal of an off-licence in respect of premises situated at 129 Thames Street, Morrinsville known as Premium Spirits and Wines. The general nature of the business is that of a bottle store.

This application was lodged on 13 July 2022. The application is made under Section 127 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. The application was advertised in the Piako Post on 20 and 27 July 2022 and no objections were received.

The day and hours of operation set out in the application are:

# Monday to Sunday from 9.00 am until 9.00 pm

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. The medical officer of health is opposed to a three year renewal period. they are not opposed to a one year truncated renewal period. This has been agreed with by all parties. Accordingly the application is determined on the papers.

The applicant, in accordance with s. 212 of the Act, has named three managers with current certificates to manage the sale of alcohol from the premises.

In deciding whether to renew an off-licence the committee must have regard to the matters set out in s.105 and 131 of the Act. These are:

#### Section 105

- (a) the object of this Act:
- (b) the suitability of the applicant:
- any relevant local alcohol policy: (c)

- (d) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:
- (e) the design and layout of any proposed premises:
- (f) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which goods:
- (g) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:
- (h) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law:
- (i) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made under section 103

# Section 131

- (a) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence:
- (b) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made by virtue of section 129:
- (c) the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.

The object of the Act is that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly, and the harm caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

The inspector has noted that as the applicant has not been trading for the past 12 months, he was unable to assess/inquire into any matters relating to the object of the Act or in which the applicant has sold, displayed, advertised or prompted alcohol under section 131(d) or whether the amenity and good order would likely to be increased.

I am satisfied as to those matters to which I must have regard and grant the renewal period of one year.

When renewing an off-licence, section 132 allows the committee to impose conditions as set out in section 116 or to vary or cancel any conditions applying to the licence before its renewal.

The renewal certificate can be issued immediately.

# **Conditions**

- a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday or Christmas

  Day or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day.

- b) Alcohol may be sold or delivered only on the following days and during the following hours:

# Monday to Sunday from 9.00 am until 9.00 pm

c) The licensee shall take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed:

- i) All staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act.
- ii) Evidence of age documents will be requested from any person appearing to be under the age of 25.
- iii) A sign shall be prominently displayed inside the premises which identifies the name of the manager on duty or the person responsible for the management of the sale and supply of alcohol under the licence.
- iv) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.
- d) The licensee shall ensure that when alcohol is being provided free, as a sample, drinking water will be made readily available, free of charge.
- e) The holder of a Manger's Certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is sold. If a duty manager is not present then there must be no alcohol sales and a notice displayed advertising the public of this fact.
- f) Manager's register (as required by s.232 of the Act) is to be maintained and available onsite.
- g) A sign in a prominent place identifying the duty manager.
- h) The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.
- There are to be no single sales of RTDs, beer and shots except single sales of craft beers (500mls).
- j) Manager's register (as required by s.232 of the Act) is to be maintained and available onsite.
